

## A LITTLE HISTORY...

The Armagnac greenway was built on a portion of the Condom/Riscle railway which connected the Morcenx/Tarbes and the Condom/Port-Sainte-Marie railways.

This line was opened to exploitation in its entirety in 1893 and enabled transport of goods and passengers.

Closed and unused for a long time, the Armagnac greenway has required significant development work in order to become a way for soft modes of transport, open to all.

## THE « DÉPARTEMENT DU GERS » TAKES ACTION...

The « Département du Gers » bought the old railway line from Condom to Eauze and decided to convert it into a greenway.

Nowadays, the greenway connects Condom to Lagrault (20 km) and will eventually be extended to Eauze.

In this exceptional site, arrangements and equipments were designed to offer you a quality and safe path, pleasant to walk.

## A GREENWAY??? WHAT IS IT?

A greenway is a way dedicated to soft transport. Open to all and free of access it enables the cohabitation of walking, cycling, riding and skating, in excellent conditions of practice.

Parking facilities allow you to park on the edge of the route, benches and picnic tables have been installed along the route to ensure you privileged moments of relaxation.

Pleasant and easy, it is ideal for family walks and offers the opportunity to relax in a wooded and quiet atmosphere.

1. I do not enter the greenway with a motor vehicle.
2. I am careful at any time and particularly at crossroads.
3. I respect the traffic signs (road traffic code).
4. I adapt my speed to the traffic.
5. I do not make my horse gallop.

7. I do not make fires into the wild.
8. I keep my dog on a leash.
9. I take with me tools to repair my bicycle (tire pump and levers, patches...).

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## ACCESS TO THE ARMAGNAC GREENWAY

### Access to the car park of CONDOM

#### • From AUCH:

Downtown, cross the river bridge named « Pont des Carmes ». At the roundabout, take the direction of Pau/Montréal/Eauze (D15). Continue left (D931) towards Pau/Eauze up to a small roundabout and turn right. At the next roundabout, take the second exit. The entrance to the greenway is located near the Saint Exupéry school and the sports complex.

### Access to the car park of MOUCHAN

#### • From VALENCE-SUR-BAÏSE:

Just outside Valence sur Baïse take the direction of Eauze (D142) and continue for approximately 5 km. At the intersection turn left towards Mouchan (D208). In Mouchan turn right towards Condom (D931) and continue for approximately 1,5 km, then turn left.

#### • From CONDOM:

In Condom, take the direction of EAUZE and continue (D931) for approximately 9 km.

### Access to the car park of LAGRAULET

#### • From EAUZE:

In Eauze take the direction of Agen/Condom, continue on the D931, then take on the left the direction of Bretagne d'Armagnac/Montréal/Nérac (D29).

Drive up to the Lagraulet village, in front of the water tower and then down to a place named « la Halte ».

#### • From MONTREAL:

In Montréal take the direction of Lauraët/Lagraulet (D113). Continue and turn at the sign « Lagraulet » (D254). After 600 m, turn left. Continue to the car park.

## SITES TO VISIT NEARBY

**Condom**, episcopal city with its 16th century Gothic cathedral and its cloister.

**Larressingle**, this small fortified village dating from the 13th century is one of the most beautiful villages. Discover this living and scenic testimony of medieval architecture.

**Cassaigne** and its castle, former residence of the bishops of Condom.

**Vopillon**, its romanesque church and its murals of the 13th century.

**Le pont d'Artigues**, is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and has always been used by the pilgrims of Saint-Jacques de Compostelle.

**Mouchan** and its romanesque church.

**Lagraulet**, the water tower and its fresco that recounts stories and legends of the route to Saint-Jacques de Compostelle.

**Gondrin**, small village nestled among the vines, its chapel of Tonnetau and its leisure park.

**Montréal**, first Bastide of Gascony built in 1255 on a rocky outcrop, is one of the most beautiful villages of France.
